ATHLETIC/ACTIVITY ELIGIBILITY





Have at least a 95% attendance record overall for grades 9-12.

Perform at least 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring. (2nd Semester of Freshman year)

Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs and/or alcohol.

Have achieved a score of proficient or advanced on the Algebra I end of course exam or a higher level DESE approved end-of-course exam in the field of mathematics. (Subject to change based on review by College Board of Higher Education)



A+

Complete the application in the A+ handbook. (Follow guidelines established by the Missouri Department of Higher Education and Seckman High School)

The year of graduation you will have to fill out the FAFSA form by April 1st.

A+

If you choose to have your child enroll, a handbook will be sent home at a later time. Please complete the last page (A+ Schools Agreement Form) in the gold booklet and turn them in, mail them, or bring the form in next year.

They may be turned in anytime before 2nd Semester of Senior Year.

Enrolling the earlier the better is your best bet, for tracking, tutoring purposes, and for encouragement of a 2.5 GPA or better along with 95% attendance, and citizenship!

You have nothing to lose by signing up! It is a motivator to get good grades and stay on track in High School!



ATTENDANCE POLICY

- The district has established that 10 absences each semester is adequate to accommodate illness, professional appointments, and other serious family or personal issues.
- 2. On the 11th absence of any hour the student will lose credit in that hour.
- Attendance is recorded by the hour as well as by day.



ATTENDANCE POLICY (cont.)

- Attendance Committees and Contracts are in place for possible credit retrieval. These are reviewed on an individual basis. These are designed to assist students with extenuating circumstances.
